

Italian Scholarship Winner: Olivia Shearer

In 2014, student Olivia Shearer applied for a language scholarship that would enable her to visit Italy for 2 months. Olivia filled in an application that showed her passion for Italian, along with her good attendance and overall high grades, plus a supporting letter from her Year Adviser and Mrs Blatchley explaining why she is worthy of the scholarship. After handing in her application, Olivia was chosen from a range of students from all over the state and placed on a shortlist with 5 other applicants. Olivia was then interviewed over Skype with board members from the Mamma Lena foundation. The next week, Olivia found out the exciting news that she had won the scholarship.

This scholarship will cover her airfare costs, a laptop and accommodation (with a host family in Rome), plus an intensive 5 week language course. Olivia will attend an award ceremony in Sydney Town Hall next week to receive her scholarship, presented by Mamma Lena and Dino Gustin.

Another student from MGHS, Amy Curtis also applied for the scholarship, but unfortunately did not make the shortlist. Despite her disappointment at not being shortlisted, she still showed great sportsmanship and excitement for Olivia's success. The school is extremely proud of both Olivia and Amy.

Language Perfect 2015

Last year our school achieved very pleasing results competing in the Language Perfect Competition with schools from around the world. We received a global rank of 78th (out of 1152 schools) and were ranked first in the state. We were extremely happy with the result of 6th in Italian, in Australia (out of 647 schools). We hope to continue to improve on these results when the 2015 Language Perfect Championships starts on Monday 18th May. SMS MESSAGING AND ATTENDANCE

If a student is away from school, parents will be informed by mobile phone Short Message Service (SMS).

At Maitland Grossmann High School, student attendance is a high priority. We know that students who attend regularly are more likely to be successful and safe at school.

To improve our attendance procedures, we will be informing parent/caregivers about any unexplained absences for their child.

The school expects parents/caregivers to contact the school in advance if they know their child is to be absent.

A SMS text message will be automatically sent to the mobile phone of parents/caregivers explaining that our records show that your child is absent from school. The message will read as follows:

MGHS records show Nick Frame is absent TUES 17/02/15. Pls reply SMS student name/reason/abs date

The message will arrive on the phone displaying the number "0428937348". Parents should store this number in their mobile phone under 'Maitland Grossmann High School" so when the message arrives, the parent is aware the message has come from the school.

Parents can then reply on your mobile phone when you receive a message from the school and add your son or daughter's name, year, date of absence and the reason they are absent or late.

E.g. Nick Frame, Year 11 was sick yesterday (Tuesday 15th November)

Text Version = "Nick F yr11 sick tues 15 nov"

OR by phoning the school office or sending a note explaining the absence.

Once we fully implement MessageYou for absences, some of the other uses could include notification of:

Announcements or reminders of meetings or forthcoming events

Band/Choir/Music Lesson reminder

Broken down or delayed School Bus

Reminders to volunteer workers

EARLY LEAVE & SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

At Maitland Grossmann High School we believe that student attendance is paramount to school achievement. **Students should only be absent from school if sick, have an unavoidable appointment or family business.** Leaving early for work with or without a reason is not acceptable. Students are required by the Department of Education to complete a specified number of hours for Sport. Students who do not complete their sport hours may not complete the School certificate requirements. <u>Please do not absent your child from Sport without a good reason.</u> When we have over 50 students apply for an early leave, we must question the validity of the leave. Parents may receive phone call to check on the early leave of their child. **Any child who misses sport more than 3 times in a term will be required to make up the sport hours**. If you have any queries about leave requirements, please contact the school.
