Road Safety at MGHS

Road safety is a nation-wide issue that influences our everyday lives. Whether you walk to school or drive your car to work, it appears in almost every aspect of our lives. It is a problem that is currently taking over the news with incidents such as road rage, speeding, drink driving etc.

One of these important road safety issues involves pedestrians. If people are unaware of correct road safety issues or do not competently observe what is happening on the road around them, it can certainly lead to a dangerous situation for pedestrians.

Recently, a student from MGHS was nearly hit by an incoming car, while crossing the Cumberland Street pedestrian crossing. The student in question was wearing headphones whilst walking. This action caused the student to be completely oblivious of the oncoming vehicle.

In response to this issue, some simple tips to help keep you safe are as follows:

- NEVER assume that an approaching vehicle can see you
- LOOK both ways before you cross. Just because someone else decides to cross, doesn't mean it's safe for you to do so
- Take out your earphones and put away your phone when walking along busy roadsides or crossing the road
- Avoid crossing between parked cars or at the front or back of any vehicle
- At intersections, check for turning vehicles before you leave the kerb as well as while you are crossing the road
- Wear bright, light coloured clothing at night or in reduced visibility conditions.

As I have stated above, if pedestrians and drivers are aware and abide by the road rules you and everyone using the road will be safe.

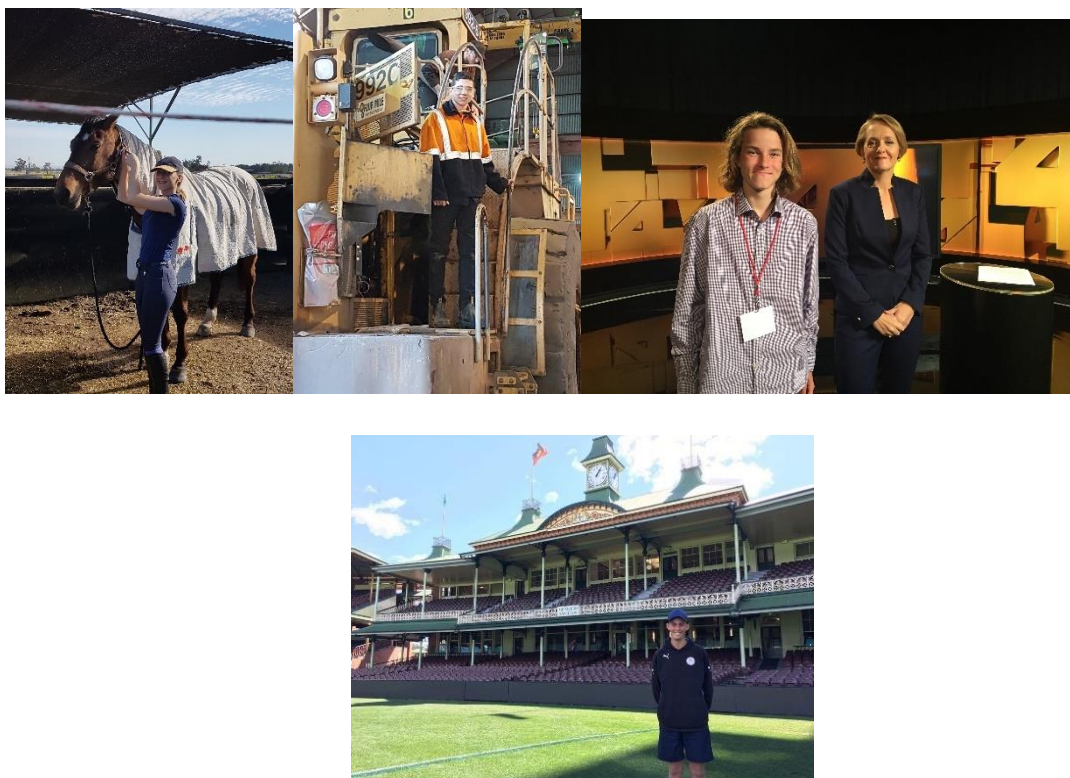


Work Experience

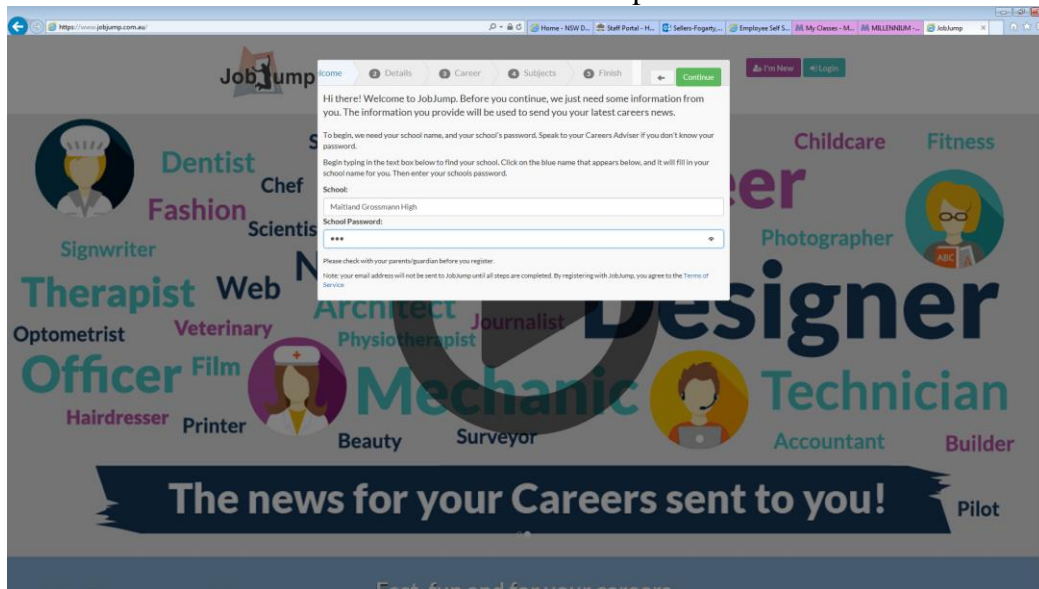

Kaeden's Day was a huge success!!



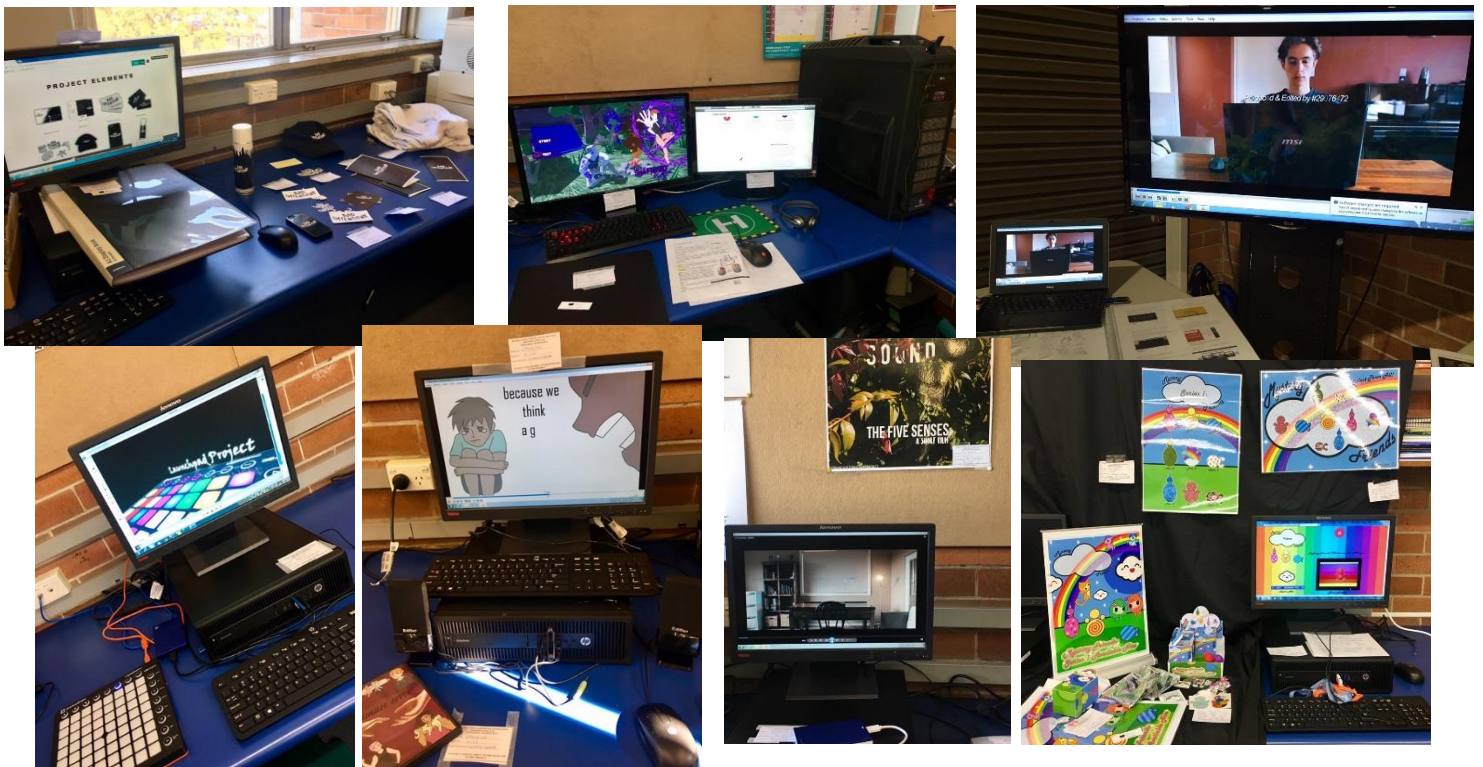

Year 9 Food Technology have been exploring a unit on Food Trends and have successfully produced their own photo shoot of Apple Pies and Funky Milkshakes.

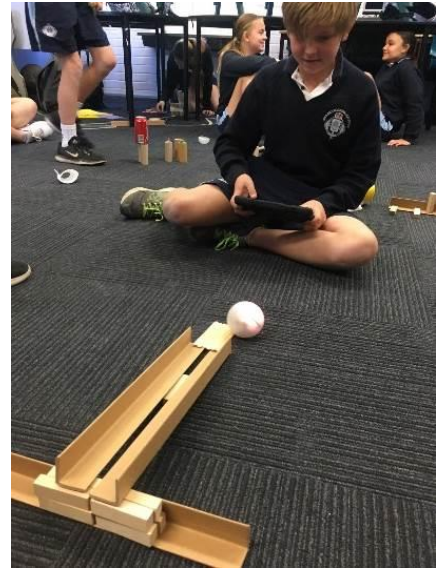
