SPORTS REPORT

Grossmann Teams

The Under 15's Boys Basketball team's run came to an end in the NSW CHS round of 32. The side was dominant in their performances against teams in the Hunter Region, advancing comfortably to the state-wide phase of the competition. Once again, the boys came up against a high-quality opponent, narrowly being defeated by Carlingford High School.



Moving into Term 4, knockout competitions that run across Term 4 and into Term 1 of the following year are under way – with both the U15's Girls Netball team and the Open Boys Cricket teams having wins lately.

NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge

The 2018 NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge has come to an end. Once again, Year 7 kept data records in their allocated sport period, with the Year 9 PASS Elective and Year 12 SLR classes also participating.

This year, MGHS was lucky enough to be visited by GWS Giants professional netballer Sam Poolman. Sam is a PSC ambassador and spoke to students about her life as a teenager growing up with the desire to become a professional sportsperson and the demands and rewards associated with this role.



Special Mention

Year 9 students **Teagan Douglas** and **Josie Morley** were selected to represent the Junior Matildas in the Kyrgyz Republic as part of the 2019 AFC U16 Women's Championship Qualifiers. The girls and their team were undefeated in the Championships, guaranteeing the Junior Matildas a place at next year's AFC U16 Women's Championship, which will be held in Thailand. Next year's AFC U16 Women's Championship will double as the qualification competition for the 2020 FIFA U17 Women's World Cup.



Cayleb Gaylard of Year 7 won three medals at the NSW CHS Trampoline Championships – placing 2nd in Tumbling, 3rd in Double Mini (DMT) and 3rd in Single Mini.

Haydyn Johnson of Year 9 represented NSW U15's at the National School Futsal Championships in Brisbane. The boys came away undefeated and took out the championship for the second year running. That's a total of 20 games over 2 years undefeated!! Such a great accomplishment!

CAREERS

Year12 students are all on the downhill slope out of school and I am seeing many excited faces glowing with anticipation of what the future holds. There has been a 5% increase in students applying for University and a 15% increase in students applying for the School Recommendation Scheme through UAC or Early entry. I have also interviewed students about numerous TAFE courses and Apprenticeship opportunities, as well as other private provider opportunities. Our 2018 Year 12 students are a diverse group who will pave their way to exciting futures, some of which, we as teachers and their parents would never have dreamed.

Seize the Day

In Careers, we have been on the go this month, commencing the term with the 'new' Year 12 'Seize the Day' which was a resounding success. Students began the day with a presentation on Memory and Mnemonics and Study Sensei by the Elevate Team. The middle sessions were about 'Getting Organised' and 'Where to from Here' looking at post school options as well as interviews from past Year 12 students. Students of course were very impressed with lunch at Billabongs and the day was finished on a high note with a presentation from key note speaker Luke Kennedy. Students completed a post program evaluation and the common consensus was very positive of the benefits of this day being bought forward to earlier in Year 11, so the supportive material can be applied earlier.......so, that's what we will do, bring the Day forward to late Term 1 or early Term 2 2019.

YES Program

Hunter Region TAFE has again given Year 10 students the opportunity this term to participate in a number of TAFE Tasters. This is a great way for students to try before they buy so to speak with students experiencing areas such as Nursing, Hospitality, Mechatronics, Defence Force Preparation, Beauty and Animal Care. Hopefully 2019 will hold the same opportunities for the incoming Year 10 students.

Adopt a Resident Program

Adopt a Resident Program continues in November with a visit to Largs Lodge and Benhome. This program involved our Year 10 students participating in four visits during Term 3 and 4, with the final visit consisting of a concert performed by our CAPA students. This community program has been running for over 10 Years and is an important part of our culture and our community connections. Students in this program are seeking or are interested in a vocational pathway into aged care, nursing and childcare and are excited for the visits ahead. The purpose of these programs is to provide an authentic experience on key life skills, defining and developing personal traits and characteristics to help support the students into the future. Upcoming Events

The following are a list of transition events that will be occurring this term.

1. Parent Meeting Monday 26/11/18 starts at 6.00pm in the MGHS School Hall.

This meeting is to introduce parents and carers to the MGHS staff who will be working closely with Year 7 2019. Headspace will also outline their service, how to access strategies to reduce young people's anxiety about the change from primary to high school.

Book pack sales and opportunity to try on school uniforms will be available from 4.00pm to 5.45pm. Book sales will be at the rear of the Hall, uniform change rooms will be in classrooms (boys and girls) close to the Hall.

2. Class placement testing 28/11/18 at MGHS – meet at the front of the school at 9.15am. Finish at 11.00am

- 30 minute comprehension test
- 30 minute creative writing test
- Short recess 10 minutes (I will take students for a walk to the Canteen where they may purchase something to eat/drink)
- 30 minute numeracy test

This test assists us to accurately place students in classes for 2019. It is very important that all students sit these assessments, as feedback from non-partner primary schools can be limited.

3. Orientation Day 4/12/18 Students meet at the MGHS Hall at 9.00. Finish by 2.15pm

The students participate in Peer Support, build a cardboard car and race it, attend taster lessons and have a sausage sizzle at lunch.
